ELCC Service Plan Update

- Five Year Service Plan is required by Ministry of Education (MEDU)
- Current plan spans 2019-2024, with a new plan to be developed for 2025-2030
- Impacts to current plan and 2025 preparations:
 - COVID-19
 - CWELCC transition
 - New funding model





ELCC Plan: EarlyON Highlights

- Expanded EarlyON outreach to 5
 partner locations and 4 libraries,
 including Northumberland Forest
- Number of visits to EarlyON increased by 118% between 2022 and 2023
- 94 families participated in EarlyON Bingo
- 5% increase in average EarlyON program attendance during this period

ELCC Plan: Child Care Highlights

2019-2023 Progress



131 new spaces



\$20-\$21 daily average fee



Needs Assessment Survey:

• 2022: **51%** reported affordability as a barrier to access

• 2023: Reduced to **1%**





ELCC Plan: Fee Subsidy Highlights

- Fee Subsidy Promotional Campaign
 - Families supported by CWELCC can also receive fee subsidy
- Early Summer 2024: Launching Online Fee Subsidy Portal
 - Will allow for secure communication
 - Online applications and electronic document management



Ongoing Service System Pressures

- Delayed and/or changing guidelines and communication
- Increased administrative burden and responsibility
- Insufficient funding and/or reduced funding
- Lack of consideration of necessary resources and funding for expansion
- Loss of direct MEDU Program Advisor support



Provincial Funding Update

- New Funding Model
 - To be announced in 2024, for implementation in 2025
- Administration and Cost Sharing Changes
 - Announced 2018, came into effect 2024
 - Adjustments to 2019 budget in preparation
 - Offset by one-time transitional grants (2021-2023)
 - Results in a decrease to program funding



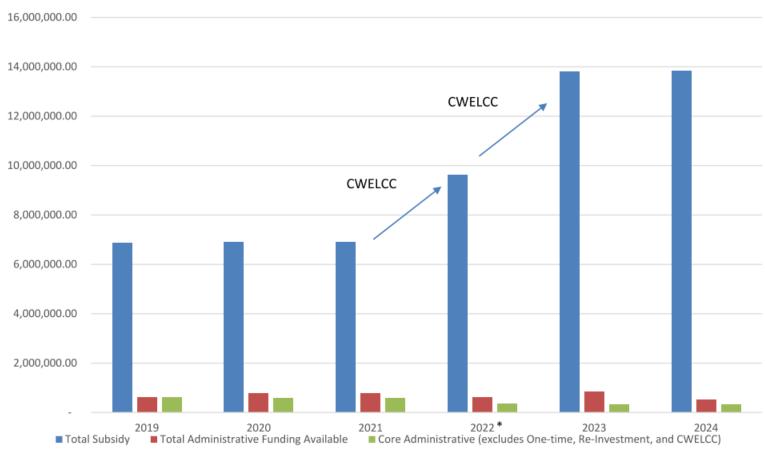
CWELCC Agreement

- CWELCC Administration Allocation shortfall
 - Increased scope and complexity of responsibilities
 - E.g., Increased oversight, compliance audits, role in licensing
 - Federal government allows for MEDU to flow up to 10% of CWELCC allocation for administration
 - Northumberland's CWELCC administration allocation is only 2.5%

CWELCC Agreement: Continued

- CWELCC Cost Escalation and Emerging Issues
 - Fees frozen as of March 2022
 - Cost Escalation Funds provided at 4.91% (i.e., below inflation)
 - Emerging Issues Funding Allocation (limited pocket)
 - To support costs beyond operator's control (rent, inflation)
- 10% CWELCC Holdback
 - Funding flexibility is limited, increased pressures due to expansion and educator wage floor adjustments
 - Anticipate that this holdback will be needed



CWELCC Agreement: Workforce Funding

Workforce Compensation Improvements

- Increase to wage floor and annual increase caps each year (to 2026)
- Anticipate 100% of RECEs will receive supports in 2024, up from 68% for program staff and 48% of supervisors

RECE Workforce Status

- 33 RECEs required to operate at capacity (+ 29 for expansion projects)
- Many positions filled with underqualified "Director Approved" staff
- Variety of recruitment & retention strategies ongoing



Directed Growth Strategy Update

- Updated Space Creation Plan approved by the Ministry
- Total spaces to be created by 2026 is 404 spaces

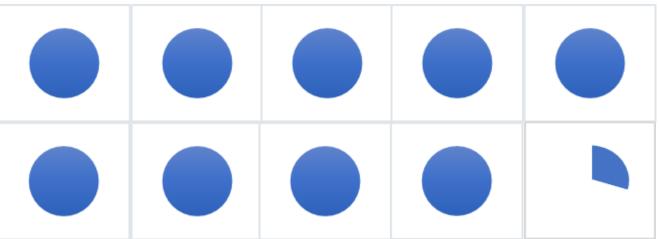

These projects utilize our full 2023 & 2024 Startup Grant. There remains 60 spaces to meet our growth plan, which requires additional funding.

Directed Growth Strategy Progress









Projected Growth and Progress Report

- 2023 Directed Growth Progress
 - 10 infant spaces (Brighton)- open and operating
 - 15 family age spaces (Cobourg)- in progress
- 2022-2024 Licensed Home Child Care Growth
 - 2022: 8 homes operating
 - 2024: 15 homes operating with 9 planned to open by mid-year
 - Total of 144 spaces via LHCC, with all 7 member municipalities represented



Summary and Next Steps

Future Expansion

- Current funding fully expended
- Will continue to work with operators and partners on identifying potential space, when more funding becomes available

CWELCC System

- County may be required to offset costs (MEDU base funding, increase in levy and/or the utilization of reserves) as system is underfunded
- Potential impacts of new funding model are unknown
- Concerns re: further cuts and/or reduced local flexibility
- EY Staff will keep Committee and Council apprised of these changes when they are shared by the Ministry
