Background

The clinic is currently operating on up-to a one-year pilot, led by Northumberland County, supported by Community Health Centres of Northumberland.

On January 25, 2024, County Council passed a motion put forth by County Deputy Warden Hankivsky, authorizing County staff to investigate the feasibility of piloting a community partnership of up to a one year to re-establish a clinic.

Northumberland County reached out to CHCN to support the initiative due to awareness that CHCN was willing, has primary healthcare expertise and is colocated with the walk-in.

Additional Background Information

HOW THE Electronic Medical Records SYSTEM WAS CHOSEN:

The CHCN investigated the feasibility of sharing their instance of TELUSHealth EMR in order to realize cost savings.

Due to the complexity of data collection, privacy legislation, and 'sunsetting' phase of the current EMR solution it was determined that this was not possible.

Through conversations with TELUS, the procurement of Collaborative Health Record (CHR) was negotiated at a 25% discount.



The Clinic So Far

Issues addressed: coughs and colds, sore throats, UTIs, medication renewals, diabetes education and related issues, tick bites, back pain, acute sinusitis

Those with no MD are requiring requisitions for screening i.e mammograms, blood work, other diagnostic testing

Location of patients: 95% local (i.e. Northumberland County) Port Hope, Cobourg, Colborne, Bewdley, Gores Landing, Baltimore etc.

5% out of town/province – i.e. Toronto, Vancouver, Sioux Falls, Florida

- IT Support & Set up Tyler Kempt (CHCN)
 - Procurement of IT equipment, set-up of EMR, facilitating training of physicians and staff, providing on-site support
- Logistics Coordination AJ Woods (Northumberland County)
 - Logistics planning, supply ordering, office set up, meeting coordination, scheduling of staff, CHR super user, clinic operational supports
- Medical Supply Support/Ordering Tammy Kantor (CHCN)
 - Ensuring medical supplies are ordered, rooms are stocked, physician requests for procedural supplies are in house

and assist physicians


Scheduling of physicians and support staff
