


# Community and Social Services

2024 Year in Review



#### **Customer Service Unit**

- On average, supported 515 in-person visits at the C&SS reception counter each month
- Provided ongoing administrative support to all C&SS Divisions, ensuring smooth operation of all programs and services
- Booked 1,033 appointments for ongoing social assistance

#### **Ontario Works**

- Launched Electronic Document Management for Ontario Works records and moved over 50% of clients to paperless communications
- Launch of Centralized Intake Expansion with the Province
- Completed Trauma Informed Care training for all department staff
- Increased presence in Community Office locations in Campbellford and Brighton
- Advocated for OW Rate Increases tied to inflation at AMO

# Professional development for EY workforce





- Outdoor pedagogy, mental health, EDI, self-regulation, Indigenous-led training, supporting children with special rights series, CCEYA training
- Sessions attended by 312 unique individuals within the Northumberland EY workforce

## Housing

- Completed Construction on Elgin Park Phase One
- Launched redevelopment plans for 123 King Street East, Colborne
- Purchased 129 Kent Street, Campbellford for expansion of 3 transitional housing units
- Continued design and pre-construction readiness with partners for 473 Ontario Street, Cobourg with a vision to build 66 units
- Finalized purchase of 699 Westwood Drive, with plans for future affordable and attainable housing initiatives
- Housed 60 households from the rent-geared-to-income waiting list
- 315 households received a rental subsidy during 2024. (COHB, Rent Supplement, Housing Stability Program)
  - 81 of these households began receiving housing subsidies in 2024 for the first time.



# Housing





### **Homelessness Services**

- 288 intentional outreach interactions (May 2024 December 2024)
- 77 people helped with last month's rent to obtain housing
- 71 people helped with rental arrears to prevent housing loss
- 44 people housed from the By-Name List
- Opened 310 Emergency Shelter Services (Warming/Cooling Hub and Emergency Shelter)
- Encampment at Brookside dissolved
- Participated in program development and tenant selection for 5 supportive housing units in Campbellford
- Supported people entering treatment for substance use
