Purpose

The purpose of this report is to highlight the opportunity to collaborate with Queens-Lakeridge, Health MD Family Medicine Program (MDFM), and the University of Ottawa with Campbellford Memorial Hospital (CMH) Medical Affairs Coordinator. These requests are facilitated through the Rural Ontario Medicine Program (ROMP).

Background

In March of this year, Northumberland Paramedic Service was approached by CMH inquiring about the possibility of offering family medicine students the ability to ride out with the Paramedics of both the Community Paramedicine (CP) Program, and the emergency 911 side.

The timing and short placement cycle will allow the first opportunity to take place June 2-6, involving a 4-6 hour ride out with the CP program. This opportunity will allow five (5) first year family medicine students from the University of Ottawa to learn about the role CPs play in the healthcare system and how we can help reduce ED visits and hospital admissions while helping individuals age safely and independently at home.

Medical students will meet the Ambulance Act and all the regulations regarding observer ship and ride outs, Communicable Disease Standards,

WSIB coverage under their educational institution.

Discussion / Options

This unique program offers second-year medical students a four-week, immersive placement in a smaller community setting, allowing them to consolidate and apply their foundational medical knowledge while gaining invaluable exposure to the varied and essential roles of a rural family physician. Many of these students have already experienced our community through previous placements and are eager to return to deepen their learning and understanding of rural medicine. In addition, this opportunity:

- Plays a pivotal role in shaping the next generation of family physicians;
- Displays the diverse and fulfilling aspects of rural family medicine;
- Helps students develop essential clinical skills through observation, supervised patient interactions, and exposure to interdisciplinary care; and
- Fosters a meaningful connection between future physicians and our community, potentially influencing their long-term career choices.

Northumberland Paramedics' priority for ride outs and preceptorship will remain Paramedic students. We will ensure we are providing the preceptorship and ride outs of our Paramedic students, and schedule efficiently not to overlap.
