Service Plan Process

- Updated Service Planning Process with Ministry
- ▶ 2024 is a pilot year of new process
- Anticipating multi-year plan starting in 2025
- Service Plan submitted to Ministry with budget submission on March 1, 2024



Updated Performance Outcomes

- Starting in 2024, municipalities who have launched Employment Services Transformation (EST) are reporting on the following performance outcomes:
 - Percentage of Ontario Works adults and ODSP non-disabled adults with participation requirements that have a valid Action Plan created
 - Percentage of Ontario Works adults and ODSP non-disabled adults with mandatory participation requirements who are referred to Employment Ontario
 - Percentage of Ontario Works Cases (individuals or family units) that exited to employment
 - Percentage of Ontario Works Cases (individuals or family units) who exit the program from any reason and returned within one year



General Program Update

- Role of Municipal Service Delivery Partner
 - Shift from administrative responsibilities to delivery of personcentred supports:
 - System navigation
 - Counselling for goal development
 - Providing supports to reduce barriers to achieving goals
 - Community based referrals
 - Common Assessment Tools
 - Standardized questions to support referral to employment resources
 - Mental Health & Addictions Screening tool

General Program Update continued



- Staffing Model at a local level
 - Focused case management staffing on emerging needs of community
 - In 2023, an Ontario Works Youth Caseworker position was added to the staffing using existing administrative budget
 - Currently, there are 9 Ontario Works Caseworker positions, supporting both the Ontario Works caseload and discretionary requests for ODSP
 - Continuing to review staffing needs based on Ministry program changes (such as Centralized Intake and Employment Services Transformation)

General Program Update Continued



- Social Assistance in Ontario is a critical piece to overall health of the community
 - Connection to Homelessness, Housing, Employment
- Ontario Works Rates have not been increased since October 2018
 - ▶ A single recipient of General Welfare received \$663 in 1993
 - A single recipient of Ontario Works receives \$733 in 2024
- Ontario Works Administration costs have remained frozen since 2018
- Ontario Works Act has over 400 rules relating to eligibility that require a high level of administration
 - Taking away caseworker time from more critical interactions that can lead to better outcomes

Ontario Works Program Update Timeline



- Office of the Auditor General of Ontario (1998, 2002, 2009, 2015, 2018)
 - 5 Value-for-Money reports focusing on deficiencies with program administration, outcome delivery and technology inadequacies
- Provincial-Municipal Fiscal & Service Delivery Review (2008)
 - Uploading of municipal costs back to province over 10-year period starting in 2008
- Commission on the Reform of Ontario Public Services "Drummond Report" (February 2012)
 - Recommended consolidation of OW and ODSP into a single program delivered at local/municipal level
- Commission for the Review of Social Assistance in Ontario "Brighter Prospects: Transforming Social Assistance in Ontario" (2012)
 - Recommendations for simplified services, ensure provision of adequate benefits, and labour market engagement to optimize client outcomes
- ▶ Social Assistance Modernization (2016 2021)
 - Targeted implementation of enhancements to the delivery of social assistance related to technology and ease of access

Ontario Works Program Update Timeline continued



- ▶ Income Security Reform "A Roadmap for Change" (2017)
 - Updated plan to implement reforms to Social Assistance, including targeted rate increases and a focus on stability supports
- ▶ Basic Income Pilot (2018 2019)
 - In pilot communities, issuing a livable income to individuals and families without attaching eligibility to participation
- Employment Services Transformation (2019, launched 2021)
 - Prototype removal of employment delivery from municipalities, with focus at a local level on person centred services
- Centralized Intake (launched 2020)
 - Provincial centralization of application process intended to free up administrative work at municipal level
- Social Assistance Recovery & Renewal (2021, currently paused)
 - To create an efficient, effective and streamlined social services system that addresses barriers and moves people toward employment and independence



Where do we go from here?

- Advocacy at the provincial level to raise the rates of Ontario Works
- Promotion at the provincial level to implement changes and reforms that will reduce administrative burden
- Continued participation in networks, such as OMSSA, Service Manager Networks, Regional ODSP & Provincial Program Supervisors/Managers
- Maintain support for the work done by the front-line staff in helping people meet their goals and succeed in our community





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
